Perspective on Faith by SK Danny Sprouse

Brother Knights, below is a Gospel reading and some thoughts for your reflection/contemplation. First, the Daily Gospel for 18 Sept 2017, 24th Week in Ordinary Time, Year I: Luke 7:1-10 (The Healing of a Centurion's Slave)

When Jesus had finished all his words to the people, he entered Capernaum. A centurion there had a slave who was ill and about to die, and he was valuable to him. When he heard about Jesus, he sent elders of the Jews to him, asking him to come and save the life of his slave. They approached Jesus and strongly urged him to come, saying, "He deserves to have you do this for him, for he loves our nation and he built the synagogue for us." And Jesus went with them, but when he was only a short distance from the house, the centurion sent friends to tell him, "Lord, do not trouble yourself, for I am not worthy to have you enter under my roof. Therefore, I did not consider myself worthy to come to you; but say the word and let my servant be healed. For I too am a person subject to authority, with soldiers subject to me. And I say to one, 'Go,' and he goes; and to another, 'Come here,' and he comes; and to my slave, 'Do this,' and he does it." When Jesus heard this he was amazed at him and, turning, said to the crowd following him, "I tell you, not even in Israel have I found such faith." When the messengers returned to the house, they found the slave in good health.

Second, Bishop Robert Barron's Gospel Reflection:

Friends, in today's Gospel Jesus is amazed at a Roman centurion's faith: I' tell you, not even in Israel have I found such faith. 'How often the Bible compels us to meditate on the meaning of faith! We might say that the Scriptures rest upon faith, remain inspired at every turn by the spirit of faith.

Faith is an attitude of trust in the presence of God. Faith is openness to what God will reveal, do, and invite. It should be obvious that in dealing with the infinite, all-powerful person who is God, we are never in control.

One of the most fundamental statements of faith is this: your life is not about you. You're not in control. This is not your project. Rather, you are part of God's great design. To believe this in your bones and act accordingly is to have faith. When we operate out of this transformed vision, amazing things can happen, for we have surrendered to a power already at work in us that can do infinitely more than we can ask or imagine. 'Even a tiny bit of faith makes an extraordinary difference.

Third, I offer some of my own reflections on this Gospel as I prepared to preside at a Communion Service on 18 September. I realized there was a great deal more to the story of the Centurion than one might first perceive, and Jesus clearly saw much more than the casual observer. Perhaps Jesus saw his Father's hand at work here in the Centurion. The Centurion showed great compassion toward his servant and valued the servants' life and respected him as a person. The Centurion also showed great respect for the Jews and their religion, and garnered their respect and admiration in return. The Centurion showed great respect for Jesus, demonstrated humility by not presuming he could directly ask Jesus, and clearly understood that Jesus spoke and acted with authority. It is quite amazing to find such great Faith in unexpected places.

Finally, I've include some excerpts from a daily Meditation guide for your contemplation.

As you develop your own prayer life consider the prayer life of Jesus. Jesus called on the power of prayer for what God wanted him to say and do. When you begin your day in prayer, you get it started in the right direction. You connect to God as a power source for your daily encounters and experiences.

You take God with you into your relationships and transactions. Starting your day in prayer is the best way to have a good one. Jesus began his ministry at the Jordan with prayer and ended it on the Cross with prayer. May God continue to Bless us all. Vivat Jesus!
