# "INSPIRATIONS OF FAITH"

#### My Brother Knights,

My recent reading ("SAINT FRANCIS OF ASSISI" by G.K. Chesterton; "COMMON SENSE 101-- LES-SONS FROM G.K. CHESTERTON" by Dale Ahlquist; and "NEW EVANGELIZATION - Passing on the Catholic Faith Today" by Cardinal Donald Wuerl), watching a movie series on EWTN about the life of St. John Paul II, and also listening to a few religious lectures I found at www.wordonfire.org has caused me to question the spiritual health of many of my fellow Catholics in today's world. The statistics are quite startling: more than 70 percent of "Catholics" are not attending Mass on a regular basis. Can it be that we are in the midst of a Spiritual Famine in our own society? By not going to Mass and not receiving Communion on a regular basis many Catholics are literally starving their Souls of the nourishment that Christ offers in the Mass and the Eucharist? Our human nature tends to gravitate toward worshiping something, but how is it that so many people now seek happiness by worshiping money, power, pleasure, and glory more than God? Therefore, I now find myself wondering what can be done to help inspire more people to participate in the Mass, to become more involved in Church related activities, and encourage more participation in the various programs offered throughout the year. What can be done to relieve this Spiritual hunger that is all around us? What can be done to make more people realize they need to feed their Souls on a regular basis and to make them feel welcome at Church? What can be done reach out to the Souls that are starving for God all around us? And just perhaps, this could make a difference in changing lives and preventing the many tragedies that seem to be so prevalent in society today. I have also come to believe that there is a fundamental need to help folks acknowledge and/or accept that religion is more than just a private affair. After all, do we not have a religious imperative to do unto others as we would have them do unto us? That cannot happen unless we get involved with our neighbors and live out our faith based moral and ethical values with one another in community. Perhaps we have all become complacent in acknowledging that religious traditions still permeate our culture and positively influence social structure. If so, how can we help our fellow Catholics realize/understand that there is more to being catholic than just attending Mass: there is a need to fully participate in the Mass and proclaim the Gospel in the way we live in society.

To help put some of these thoughts in perspective. I will borrow a few comments from a lecture given by Cardinal Donald Wuerl on what the Church and her moral teaching and her social teaching brings to modern culture today: early on in this lecture Cardinal Wuerl related a story from a previous presentation to an interfaith gathering at Harvard University on what Faith brings to a modern pluralistic society, and a follow-up question from a self-professed atheist from the Harvard Law School (The Atheist asked: "What do you people think you bring to our Society?") to which Cardinal Wuerl responded "May I ask you a question?" And the man said Yes. Then Cardinal Wuerl asks the following: What do you think this world would be like if it were not for the voices of all those religious traditions that permeate our culture? What would it be like if you did not hear in the midst of all our communities things like you shall not Kill, you shall not steal, you shall not bear false witness? What would our culture be like if we had never heard religious imperatives like love your neighbor as yourself, do unto other as you would have them do unto you? How much more harsh would our world be if we hadn't grown up hearing blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, blessed are the merciful, blessed are the peach makers? What would the world be like if we were never reminded that someday we are going to have to answer for how we have lived in this world?" Then Cardinal Wuerl said: "And too his credit the man smiled very broadly and said: it would be a mess." Cardinal Wuerl then continued on: "And it would. What the religious faith, what the Catholic Church in her moral, in her social, and in her doctrinal teaching brings to the public square is what the church and faith has always brought, recognition of the spiritual dimension of human life, of our relationship to God...'My Brother Knights our religion is much more than just a private matter; it is a necessary public expression of how to live and maintain a civilized society and has positively impacted the world for centuries. Let us not hide behind closed doors, but proudly live our Faith within our communities and demonstrate the Christian way of

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life in everything we do. We must not let the negatives created and sometimes perpetuated by human failings overshadow all the good. After all, religious truths have been instrumental and continue to help form the moral and ethical boundaries needed to have a truly free and modern society. Every society has rules and laws that guide daily living, without which there is chaos and religious truths and moral and ethical teachings are the foundation for living a Christian life. However, if we truly love our neighbor and will the good of the other, it is not prudent to permit our society to ignore core truths and degenerate into a mere battle of human wills because after all, we do believe "that someday we are going to have to answer for how we have lived in this world."
