SUNDAY READING REFLECTIONS

Lent, 2nd Sunday – B 2018 [Mark 9:2-10]

Our Transfiguration

On the second Sunday of Lent we recall and proclaim the story of the Transfiguration of Jesus, witnessed by Peter, James, and John.

The three of them undergo a kind of transfiguration themselves. They are changed so that they are able to more clearly hear God's voice announcing Jesus' identity ("Beloved Son"), and the clear terms of their own discipleship ("Listen to Him").

Lent is meant to be a time of Transfiguration for all disciples of Jesus. It is a time for us to reflect on who Jesus really is (the "Beloved Son of God"), the Word who is the manifestation of God's presence among us.

Lent is a time to consider what change needs to occur in us so that we come to understand how we might be transfigured, that we fully grasp the terms of our own discipleship.

Lent is a time for us to tune in, to listen intently to Jesus, to be willing to be changed (transfigured). And act accordingly.

Over the course of the year, Rose became a campus icon and she easily made friends wherever she went. She loved to dress up and she reveled in the attention bestowed upon her from the other students. She was living it up.

At the end of the semester we invited Rose to speak at our football banquet. I'll never forget what she taught us. She was introduced and stepped up to the podium. As she began to deliver her prepared speech, she dropped her three by five cards on the floor.

Frustrated and a little embarrassed she leaned into the microphone and simply said, 'I'm sorry I'm so jittery. I gave up beer for Lent and this whiskey is killing me! I'll never get my speech back in order so let me just tell you what I know.'

As we laughed she cleared her throat and began. 'We do not stop playing because we are old; we grow old because we stop playing.

There are only four secrets to staying young, being happy, and achieving success. You have to laugh and find humor every day. You've got to have a dream. When you lose your dreams, you die.

We have so many people walking around who are dead and don't even know it!

There is a huge difference between growing older and growing up.

If you are nineteen years old and lie in bed for one full year and don't do one productive thing, you will turn twenty years old. If I am eighty-seven years old and stay in bed for a year and never do anything I will turn eighty-eight.

One week after graduation Rose died peacefully in her sleep.


Over two thousand college students attended her funeral in tribute to the wonderful woman who taught by example that it's never too late to be all you can possibly be.
